- Author of books on James Clerk Maxwell, Columba, and Moffat
- Transition from "creative Episcopalian to moralistic Presbyterian"
- Core premise: Living Christian life means allowing risen Christ to live through us via active surrender

## Four Theological Concepts of "In Christ"

## • In Christ and Knowledge of God

- o Spurgeon's distinction: apprehension vs comprehension
  - Apprehension: partial, incomplete, tentative knowledge
  - Comprehension: total, encompassing understanding
- o Mary's faith apprehended God's promise without fully comprehending it
- o Only Jesus truly knows the Father; we know God through Christ

#### • In Christ and Christian Repentance

- Spurgeon's definition: discovery of sin's evil + mourning + resolution to forsake
  + deep mind change
- Repentance is response to grace (evangelical) rather than pre-condition for grace (legal repentance)
- o T.F. Torrance's approach: repentance as intellectual change within epistemology context
- o Must involve profound heart, will, and mind transformation not just intellectual shift
- o Grace as response, not license for moral compromise

## • In Christ and Sanctification

- o Sanctification complete in Christ, not self-accomplished
- o Church/Christian: Christ-centered, not self-centered
- o Discipleship = disciplined habit of thinking/acting in Christ
- Life of ongoing dying and rising with Christ
  - Baptism: once-and-for-all union with Christ
  - Eucharist: daily dying to self, rising in Christ
- o Living between "fallen time and new time" until Christ returns

## • In Christ and Nature/Grace Relationship

- o Grace transforms nature through cross and resurrection
- o Humanity redeemed, not replaced
- o Natural gifts must be crucified in Christ and reborn
  - Examples: public speaking, intellect, teaching, leadership, music

- Process: surrender ego  $\rightarrow$  take to cross  $\rightarrow$  allow redemption
- o Even spirituality requires cross surrender

## **Key Principles & Applications**

- All natural gifts need cross transformation, not just blessing
- Difference between natural conscience and Spirit's work
- Hudson Taylor: "Unsatisfied life lies in unsurrendered life"
- Church needs pastors who've had "swagger gospeled out of them"
- Personal example: Minister Jim's guitar set aside for years, then redeemed for ministry
