# Baby booklet on the Trinity – engagement strategies for the next generation

### **Trinity Booklet Project Overview**

- Marc developing children's booklet on Trinitarian theology
  - o Target age: toddlers (2-4 years old), similar to board book series
  - o 5 sections with 4-5 propositions each
  - o AI-generated artwork throughout
- Personal motivation: Trinity rarely addressed substantively
  - o Only 1-2 Trinity sermons in past 5 years
  - o Common analogies lead to errors of modalism and partialism
  - o Aims to help lay foundations about who God is, early in children's development

#### **Booklet Structure & Content**

- Section breakdown:
  - 1. God is one (love, forever, creator, with us)
  - 2. God is three (Father, Son, Spirit community of love)
  - 3. God loves us (He created us, brought us into communion)
  - 4. Jesus reveals profound love
  - 5. We live in His love (Spirit enables knowing God)
- Recurring theme: "You are included"
- Simple format: one image per page, short statement, parent explanation text
- Spiral pedagogy approach: present truth even if not fully explained

#### Feedback & Concerns Received

- Age appropriateness questions:
  - o Abstract concepts like "forever" may be too advanced for toddlers
  - o Missing response to "what's gone wrong" children's negative experiences
  - o Suggestion for series: basic concepts first, deeper questions in follow-up books
- Theological concerns:
  - o Visual representation of God problematic (looks like imagery of the sun)
  - o Terminology of 'father' may trigger those with negative parental experiences
- Design feedback:
  - Add full color backgrounds to pages
  - o Consider interactive elements (lift-the-flap features)
  - o Board or soft cover book format essential for target age
  - o AI art concerns discussed consider hiring illustrator

## **Distribution & Next Steps**

- Publishing options under consideration:
  - o Self-publish
  - o Established publisher for credibility/distribution
  - o Start with PDF distribution, grow organically
- Companion materials needed:
  - o Parent's guide for reading and handling questions
  - o Move "where to learn more" section to parent's guide
- Testing planned:
  - o Nursery leader feedback (ages 2-3)
  - o Baby and toddler group trial
